VESPERS AND BENEDICTION

Evensong, sometimes called Vespers, is an ancient monastic service said or sung sometime in the evening. This brief service is composed of readings, chants, psalmody, silence, and prayers, and it is one of the hallmarks of the Anglican choral tradition of which the Episcopal Church is a part.

Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is a form of Eucharistic Adoration that is popular in many Episcopal churches, as well as in Roman Catholic churches. The host is displayed in a monstrance, the origin of this word meaning "to show," so that the faithful might have an opportunity to reflect upon God's indwelling among us, whether in the Sacrament or in our very lives. The service concludes with the priest making the sign of the cross over the congregation with the monstrance as a form of blessing.

All stand and say the Our Father and Hail Mary silently.



Blessed be her glorious Assumption.


Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother.
