




AT THE BAPTISMAL FONT

The people are sprinkled with blessed water in remembrance of their baptism. It is customary to cross oneself when sprinkled.





READING Acts of the Apostles 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs~ in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy.' And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.







Jesus said to his disciples, "When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf. You also are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning. I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. But now I am going to him who sent me; yet none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your hearts. Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. And when he comes, he will prove the world wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment: about sin, because they do not believe in me; about righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will see me no longer; about judgment, because the ruler of this world has been condemned. I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you."






ORATE FRATRES AND SECRET




OUR FATHER

The music is S 119 in the Hymnal 1982.

FRACTION Holding the paten upright upon the altar, the Celebrant says secretly:

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, and at the intercession of the blessed and glorious Ever-Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with your blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and with Andrew, and all the Saints, † graciously grant peace in our days that by the help of your mercy, we may be delivered from all sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

The Celebrant kisses the Paten and places it under the Host. The Chalice is uncovered, and the Celebrant genuflects and breaks the Host over the Chalice. Breaking off a particle, the Celebrant makes the † sign of the cross over the Chalice with the particle three times, saying:



The Celebrant places the particle into the Chalice and says secretly:

May this mingling and consecration of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it. Amen.

AGNUS DEI

As the Agnus Dei is sung, the Celebrant bows and says the following prayers quietly, which the worshipper ought to also pray secretly:

Lord Jesus Christ, you said to your apostles, "Peace I give to you; my own peace I leave with you:" Regard not our sins, but the faith of your Church, and give to us the peace and unity of that heavenly City, where with the Father and the Holy Spirit you live and reign, now and for ever. Amen.

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who by the will of the Father, and the work of the Holy Spirit, through your Death gave life to the world, deliver me by this, your most sacred Body and Blood from all my sins and from every evil: keep me always faithful to your commandments, and never let me be parted from you. Amen.

The Celebrant genuflects, saying secretly:

I will receive the Bread of Heaven, and call upon the name of the Lord. Amen.

INVITATION AND COMMUNION

- V: Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.
- R: Lord I am not worthy that you should come under my roof, but speak the word only, and my soul shall be healed.

In the Episcopal Church all baptized Christians are welcome to receive Holy Communion. For those who are not baptized, you are invited to come forward for a blessing by the priest, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest. If you desire to be baptized, please speak with the clergy after the mass. The people remain kneeling during communion.

Extend your hands forward to receive the host; to receive the wine, drink from the chalice. If you do not wish to drink from the chalice, the Eucharistic Minister will dip the host into the chalice for you and place the host upon your tongue. Low gluten hosts are available upon request.
